Johanna Calle is a Colombian artist widely recognized for her thought-provoking works on paper that address significant social and political issues. She draws inspiration from her Latin American background and incorporates an expanded concept of drawing in her practice to create complex, symbolically charged representations. Calle pursued her artistic education at the Universidad de Los Andes in Bogotá, where she earned her BA in Art in 1989. She then furthered her studies and obtained a Master of Fine Arts from Chelsea College of Art and Design in London in 1993. Calle's works have been particularly noteworthy for shedding light on important issues such as social inequality, violence, ecological concerns, and the loss of cultural identity.
